- Russian Outreach Network (Scott and Carmen LaRue, ministry to Russian-speaking peoples to make disciples through planting churches, training local leaders, and providing printed materials).
- Man in the Mirror (Bernie Kaufman). For 30 years MIM has been equipping men to disciple men in local churches.

Gatlinburg Tennessee Fire Destruction

International Disaster Emergency Service, a sponsored mission by PVCC, is currently working with the Smokey Mountain Christian Church with assistance. The fires in the woodlands and into communities absolutely devastated the area. Homes of families were damaged or completely destroyed. The clean-up process continues to be underway and the recovery will take a long time. IDES is moving into areas as it becomes safe to assist during the recovery. Sheds for storage of recovered items or a safe place for a family's food or re-construction tools will be used in places necessary for affected families.

January 29 will be designated as Gatlinburg Day and our IDES "blue fish" offering containers will be distributed and the return date will be March 26, 2017. This offering will be sent to show there is still hope and it comes in Jesus and his followers.

ELDER CORNER:

Happy New Year. The New Year brings a time of reflection and planning. A time to put your house in order and start down the road to lose a few pounds or clean up some debt. Maybe both. Do you know that one of the most talked about subject in the Bible is money? But it is the least talked about in churches today. Why is that? I believe that "the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil". With the culture we are living in, we are taught that money and stuff are the key to happiness and so we have just a bit of love for money. We look at the rich and think, "they have it made. If only I had what they had, I'd be happy." That jealousy then causes us get ourselves into debt. And when you are in debt it feels like you've built a house of cards and any little thing will cause it all to come crashing down. Every day you become more worried as you play the payment shuffle. You don't know how you are going to pay for lunch let alone give to back to God. So of course you don't want to hear a sermon about how easy it should be to give, the preacher has no clue what's it like.

Or maybe your situation is a bit better off. You have your house in order. You've worked hard for you money and don't spend it foolishly. You give out of your excess, when you have the money and see the need. Giving is easy for you, but you never sacrifice. You don't want to hear the church begging for money. You had to scrimp and save, so should the church.

God doesn't call us to give to the church. God calls us to live as if everything we own is His. Part of that is to give to Him through the church. But, He doesn't need our money, He already owns everything. He wants us to recognize we are just stewards to His creation. That what we have isn't ours, and that we need to be looking to Him for how to handle all the money entrusted to us not just our Sunday offering. Yes the church needs to pay the bills, but that isn't why we give. Corinthians 9:7 says "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." We give because we love God and want Him and others to see that love. This can be either through the church or just helping out your neighbor who needs their driveway shoveled.

I want you to know that we know that this isn't easy. We know some of you are deep in debt and don't see any way out, or just don't quite grasp the steward-ship idea. Please know that the church and the Elders are here for you. We'd love to talk to you about how God loves you and can help you through. We are also looking at classes we can offer. Let us know if you are interested or could help out.

Beans (Refried, Chili, Pork-N-Beans, Baked, Kidney)


